Types of Obsessional Neuroses

1) Obsessional Ideas. 2) Obsessional Affects.: a -self-reproaches. b –shame. c –hypochondriacal anxiety. d –social anxiety. e –delusions of being noticed. **f**-fear of temptation, etc.

Types of Obsessional Neuroses • 3) Obsessional Actions (Rituals).: - penitential ceremonies: -burdensome ceremonials. -observations of numbers, etc. - precautionary measures: -all sort of phobias. -pedantry. -superstitions. -overconscientiousness.

-collecting scraps of paper.
-seclusiveness.
measures ensuring some numbing of the mind:
-dipsomania.



Fear of Contamination

Fixation and regression in O.N.

 1) An important fixation at the anal-sadistic stage is a sine-qua-non of an Q.N.

 2) A regressive move from oedipal phase to anal-sadistic stage occurs (defusion).

 3) The ego-superego reacts with horror to the anal-sadistic regression.

Characteristics and Clinical Picture

1) Lack of belief in the obsessional thoughts

• 2) Anxiety at the interruption of the ritual.

• 3) Thinking in Obsessional Neuroses.

• 4) Ambivalence in Obsessional Neuroses.

1) A precondition of O.N is a very precocious ego.

Ego Defences and O.N.


- 1) Repression.
- 2) Displacement.
- 3) Reaction Formation.
- 4) Intellectualization.
- 5) Doing and Undoing.
- 6) Isolation of Affects.
- 7) Isolation of Contents.

The Super-Ego in O.N.

• 1) Very severe, punitive and archaic.

2) Partly related to ego precociousness.

 3) Partly related to libidinal regression (defusion of instinct with aggresivity going to the super- ego).
